

Time with the Children

Sharing of Joys and Concerns

First Reading: Acts 8:25-31

²⁶An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³²Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. ³³In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about

himself or about someone else?" ³⁵Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" ³⁸He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

Following the reading:

Word of God, word of life. Thanks be to God!

Second Reading: 1 John 4:7-21

⁷Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. ⁹God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. ¹⁰In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. ¹¹Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. ¹²No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

¹³By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. ¹⁵God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. ¹⁶So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. ¹⁷Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ¹⁹We love because he first loved us. ²⁰Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. ²¹The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

Following the reading:

Gospel Reading: John 15:1-8

The Holy Gospel according to John. Glory to you O Lord!

Jesus said: ¹"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. ²He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. ³You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Do you promise to nurture Tate in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church? **We do**.

People of God, do you promise to support Tate, and to pray for him in his new life in Christ? **We do.**

Profession of Faith

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Parents and Sponsors: We do.

With this congregation and the whole church, let us confess our faith:

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Thanksgiving at the Font

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. 


Communion



Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

By this week, this Easter call and response feels a bit tiresome. The lilies have lost their last petals. The drape on the cross has become a bit limp and dusty. It's hard to keep up Easter Sunday energy as the rest of the world has moved on and all but forgotten the resurrection we celebrated so grandly just a month ago.

Last week, I was at Mar-Lu-Ridge, and I ran into a pastor friend and asked how her Easter, her first in a new congregation, had been. Her son, whom I've known since the day he was born, seized the moment and said, "I hate to correct you (he didn't hate it), but it's still Easter!"

How soon I forget! How quickly we throw in the towel! Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia! is the cornerstone of our Christian identity and calling. These nine words make possible, and even make necessary, all the other words I speak about Jesus Christ and the love of God.



Without this declaration - Christ is risen! - there would be no foundation to our life and ministry together. The things we do would still be good things, of course. It is good to support shelters and food shelves. It is generous to collect cookie and socks for seafarers. It is important to create safe places for kids to come and build strong relationships. It is healthy to gather together and live in community. But, without the resurrection of Jesus Christ and the promise we've received in our baptisms to share in his victory over death, these things could all be done just as well at the local community center.

Over these last weeks, we have heard the ongoing witness of Jesus' resurrection. The testimony of the disciples, and their sometimes fleeing encounters with the risen Lord Jesus, reminds us of the splendid truth of that Jesus lives.

As we continue to confess, celebrate, and proclaim the resurrection during these last weeks of the Easter season, we do so with the risen and living Lord Jesus, still busy loving, forgiving, and equipping us to be the church, the body of Christ alive in the world. Alleluia, indeed!
